14 सितंबर 1949

6. 29TH WORLD OZONE DAY

Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC), celebrated the 29th World Ozone Day at Stein Auditorium, India Habitat Centre, New Delhi. World Ozone Day is celebrated on 16th September each year to commemorate the signing of the Montreal Protocol, an international environmental treaty for phasing out of production and consumption of Ozone Depleting Substances.

World Ozone Day is celebrated every year to spread awareness among people about the depletion of Ozone Layer and the measures taken/ to be taken to preserve it.

On 16th Sept,2023,the Ozone Cell, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India celebrated the World Ozone Day at the National and State levels. Our School students alongwith teachers attended the learning session. **Ms. Leena Nandan Secretary**, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change was the Chief Guest for the event. Addressing the event, she emphasized that India has been proactive in the Montreal Protocol implementation and highlighted achievements of the country.



To create awareness among the students to protect the Ozone Layer, competitions in the categories of Poster and Slogan Writing were organized for school children across the country. The winning entries for the above-mentioned activities were added in publications, released in the function by the Chief Guest. Highlighting the issue of ozone depletion a documentary Films (Animation video) of **messages by Prakriti** and a documentary film on **India's Success Story** on implementation of Montreal Protocol was presented. Students enjoyed the rewarding session.
