- Arranging and packing their school bag, notebook, books and toys .
- Learning how to zip their school bag and their clothes.
- Sorting and pairing household items.

**\*Help me imbibe these Social manners and etiquette :**

- **Imbibe these Social manners and Etiquette's in your child:**
- Loving the younger ones.
- Wishing and welcoming guests.
- Speaking politely with visitors and relatives.

- Keeping the house clean and tidy.
- Speaking politely.
- Helping with household chores.
- Ensure toys are kept in their place after playing.
- Practicing personal hygiene independently.
- After eating, placing the plate in the kitchen.
- Correct use of magical words like: Sorry, Thank you, Excuse me and Please
- Motivate her/him to never throw the wrappers around.
- Guide your child not to waste water. Every drop is precious!
- Motivate your child to turn off lights and other appliances whenever they leave the room.
- Help your parents by watering the plants.
- Helping your grandparents with small age appropriate tasks such as bringing them things they need.
- Help parents set up dining table before lunch and dinner.
